Exclusively for non-native speakers, the ESL program offers five levels of instruction ranging from Foundations to Advanced levels and ultimately the English for Academic Purposes level. Upon completion of the ESL program, you'll receive a General Arts and Science Ontario College Certificate, and you may apply to other college programs at Sheridan without further language testing required.

Hands-on learning

The ESL program encourages classroom interaction. You'll work on group projects and assignments that require interaction in the community. You'll practice speaking and listening in a computerized language lab, and you'll learn to conduct computer research, note taking and essay writing in English.

English for Academic Purposes

The program's highest level, English for Academic Purposes (EAP), prepares you for academic success in an English-speaking college or university environment. At the EAP level, you'll take one General Education course of your choice for credit in your post-secondary program along with an introductory computer communications course.

Applicant Selection

Students will be placed in the appropriate level based on their English as a Second Language Placement Test results.
