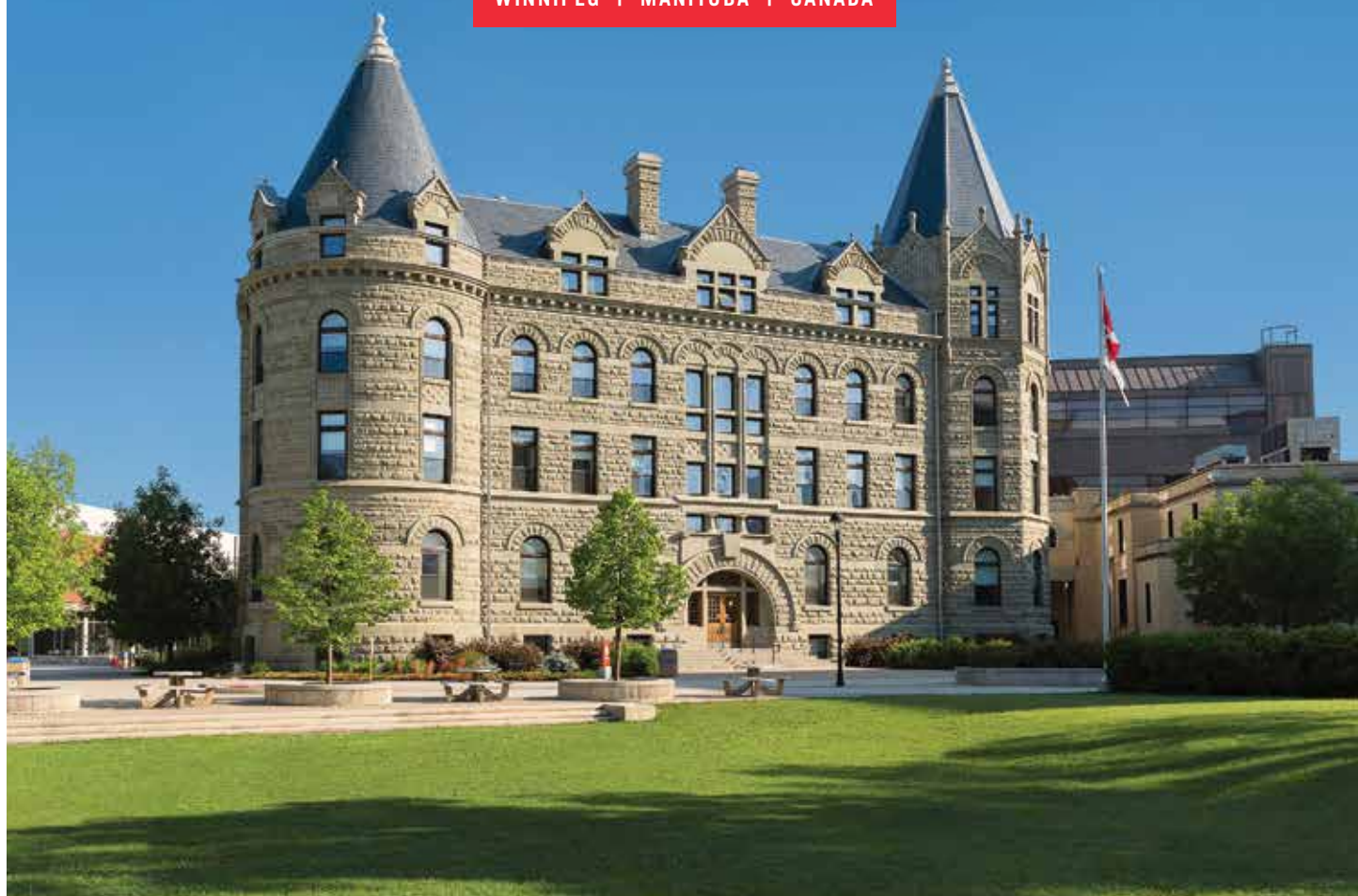

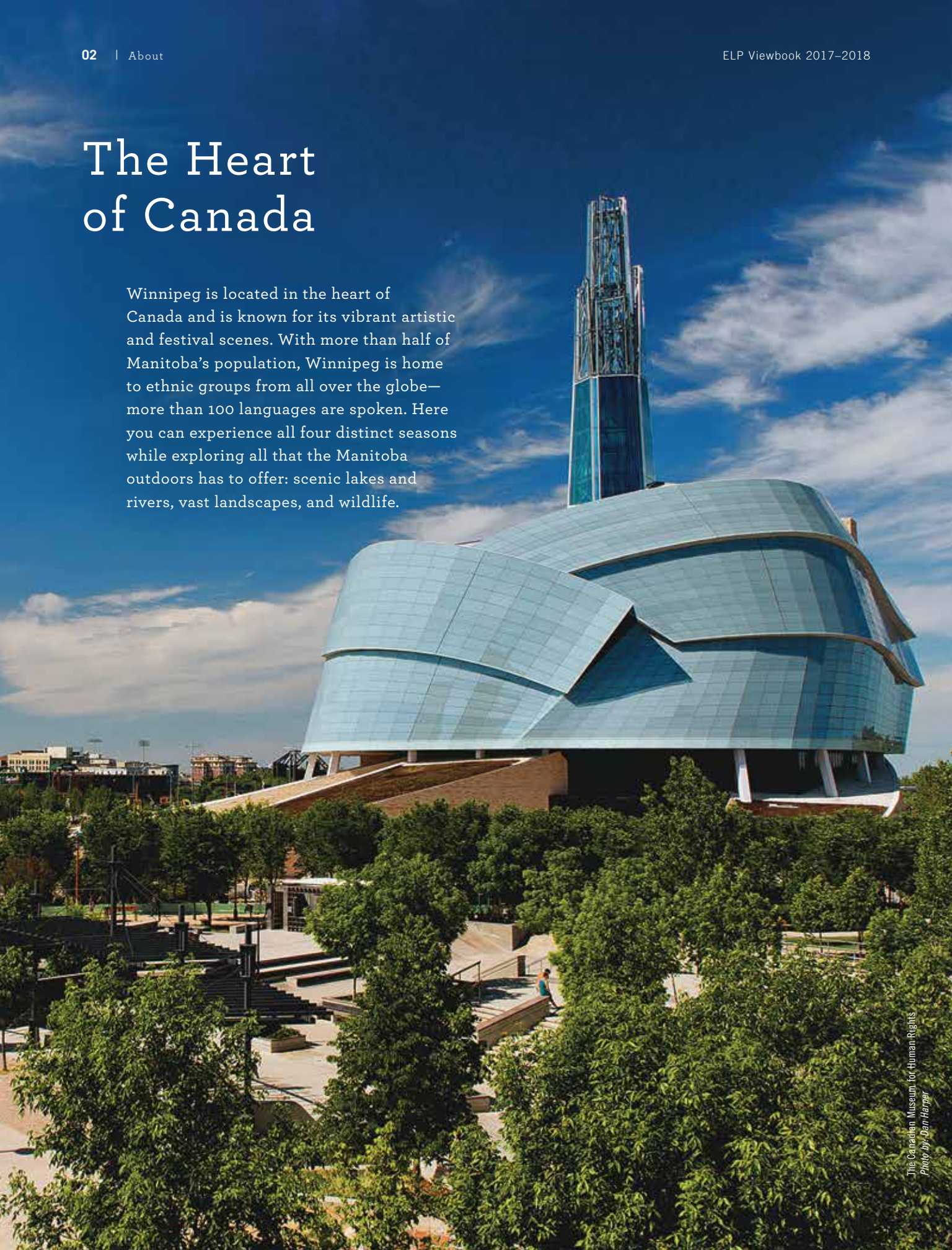

Home Away From Home

At The University of Winnipeg, we make you feel at home. Our homestay program, socio-cultural activities, and language partner programs offer you the chance to improve your English while having fun and creating lasting friendships.



CANADIAN IMMIGRATION

Once you receive your letter of acceptance, you can use it to apply for appropriate visas or permits.

Depending on your country of citizenship, you may also need a temporary resident visa or an Electronic Travel Authorization before leaving your home country.

(Note: Some nationalities may not require a visa to study in Canada.)

HEALTH INSURANCE

Health coverage is required during your stay in Canada. An international student insurance plan is provided through *guard.me International Insurance*.

Students without a study permit will pay a daily rate that will include two days before and after the program date. Students with a study permit for six months or more will pay a reduced, set monthly fee. Contact us for current rates per program.

If your study permit is longer than 6 months, you qualify for Manitoba Health Insurance at no cost and should apply as soon as you arrive. This coverage will supplement your international student insurance plan.

HOMESTAY

Take advantage of our Homestay Program and live with an English-speaking family, couple, or single person in Winnipeg. It's a great way to adjust to life in Winnipeg, practice your English language skills, and learn about Canadian life and culture.

Host families are evaluated carefully, and offer a safe, comfortable home environment. You can expect a private, furnished room; internet; three meals a day; and the experience of being part of a Canadian family.

Homestay fees vary by program and include an airport pick-up, private bedroom, shared bathroom, and food. There are one-time application and placement fees due with the homestay application – see page 15, “Fees Due with Your Application”.

English Language Program (ELP)

The University of Winnipeg's English Language Program welcomes over 450 students from more than 30 countries each year. We offer a variety of programs: Academic and General English, Short Term Intensive English, Canadian Workplace Experience, ESL Teacher Certificate, and Customized Programs. We are accredited by Languages Canada, as well as being an authorized CanTEST (Canadian Test of English for Scholars and Trainees) test centre, and an IELTS test venue.

ACADEMIC/PATHWAY ENGLISH PROGRAM

This program prepares you to enter Canadian universities, colleges, and high schools, and targets all four language areas: reading, writing, listening, and speaking. You will improve your ability to read academic materials, write essays, take notes, listen to lectures, and give presentations — skills you will need to be successful in a Canadian university. When you complete the highest level of this program, you will meet the English Language Proficiency Requirement for admission to UWinnipeg's undergraduate degree programs, select graduate programs, and Professional, Applied and Continuing Education (PACE), and earn credit that can be applied to further study at UWinnipeg.

GENERAL ENGLISH PROGRAM

This program enables you to advance your English language skills for personal and professional purposes, and targets the language areas of reading and writing, while emphasizing listening and speaking. You also will participate in a variety of seminars such as vocabulary, TOEFL and IELTS preparation, reading, writing, conversation, and pronunciation.

FOUNDATIONS ENGLISH PROGRAM

This program prepares you to enter our Academic/Pathway or General programs. If you're beginning with a low to intermediate English level, you will start in the Foundations stream of the program.

Short Term Intensive English Program

This 4–5 week program will provide you with a short, intensive English language learning experience to help advance your educational or career goals. Our program is designed to accelerate your communication development with classes that focus on the core skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing, with conversation classes to build vocabulary, and a variety of cultural and academic workshops to improve speaking ability.

Weekly socio-cultural activities are also a great way for you to practice your new language skills while exploring Winnipeg.

Canadian Workplace Experience Program

uwinnipeg.ca/elp-cwep

This 7-week English program offers 4 weeks of classroom study followed by a 3-week volunteer placement, giving you the opportunity to speak English in a Canadian work environment.

Types of placements include architecture firms, museums, libraries, radio stations, youth centres, athletic facilities, art galleries, health care facilities, restaurants, retail stores, and non-profit businesses.

Students also participate in after-class socio-cultural activities to practice their informal English skills.

The recommended language levels for prospective students are TOEFL: iBT 61, IELTS: 5.5 overall, TOEIC: 800, or equivalent ELP program score.

ESL Teacher Certificate Program

uwinnipeg.ca/elp-tcp

This program will certify you to teach English as a Second Language (ESL) to adults in Canada and overseas, and is fully accredited by TESL Canada. This program is available full-time (in-person) or part-time (in-person or online). The program includes 120 hours of TESL theory and methodology, 10 hours of observation in a Canadian ESL classroom, and 10 hours of teaching in a supervised practicum in Canada.

Scholarships for International Students

The University of Winnipeg believes in fairness and equality. International students are eligible for the same awards opportunities as Canadian students. Values range from \$500–\$5,000. There are also some awards available to international students only.

PRESIDENT'S SCHOLARSHIP FOR WORLD LEADERS

This scholarship will be given to international students (including U.S. students) entering any of UWinnipeg's divisions for the first time. Candidates must be involved in activities that demonstrate leadership, have a minimum 80% admission average or equivalent, and be entering the first year of any program.

Value: \$3,500–\$5,000

Number: 15

IN-COURSE AWARDS

After completing one year (two terms) at UWinnipeg, international students can apply for a wide range of awards and scholarships for continuing students.
